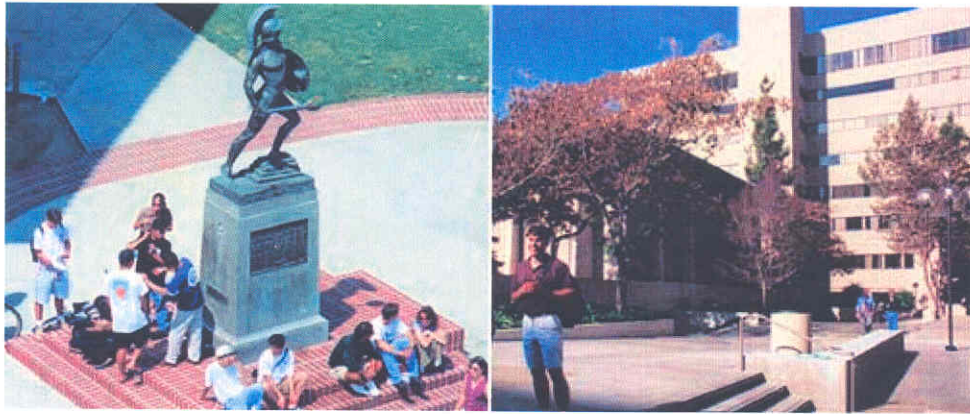

Class Distribution of Fall 2004 International Student Enrollment

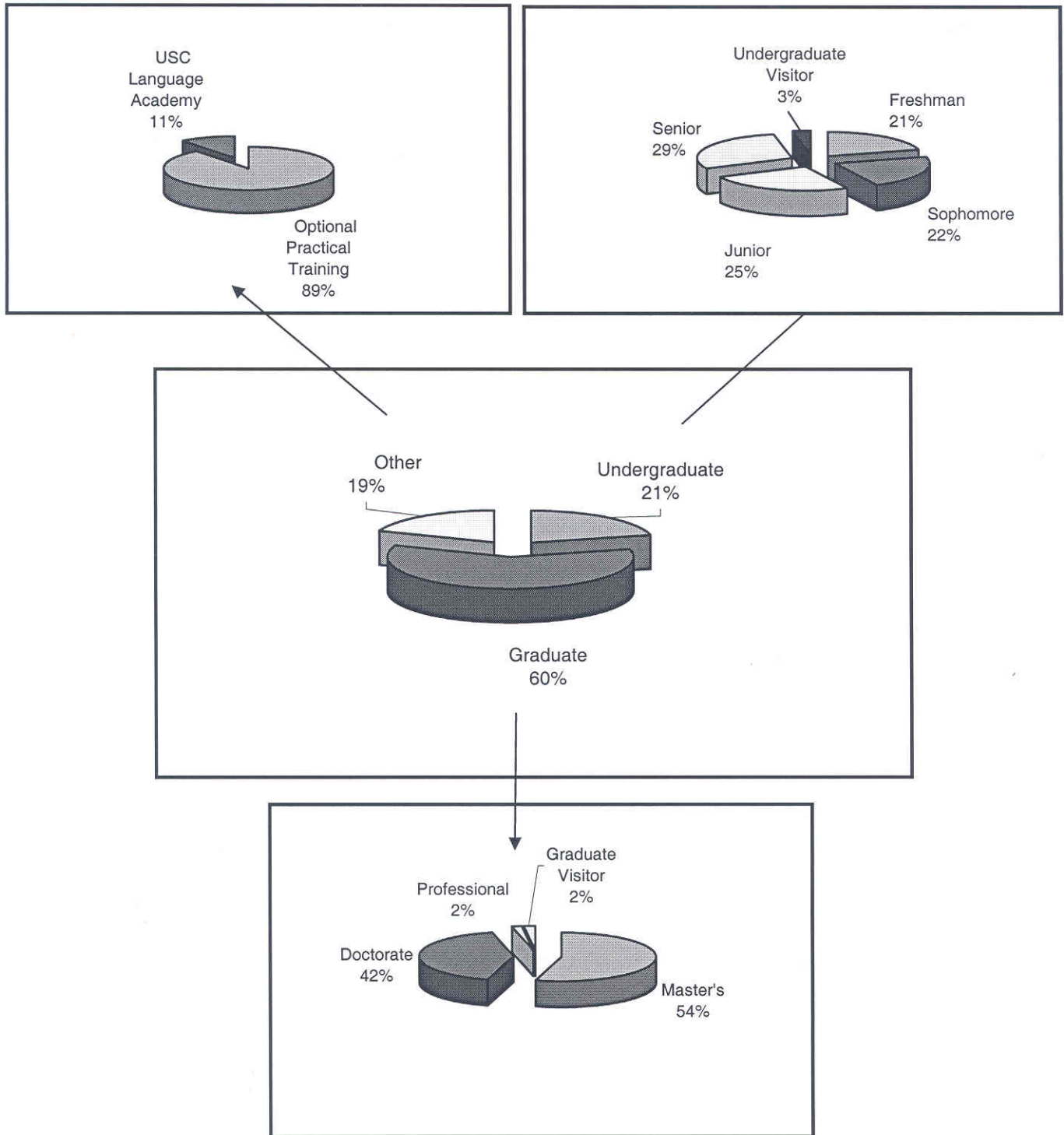

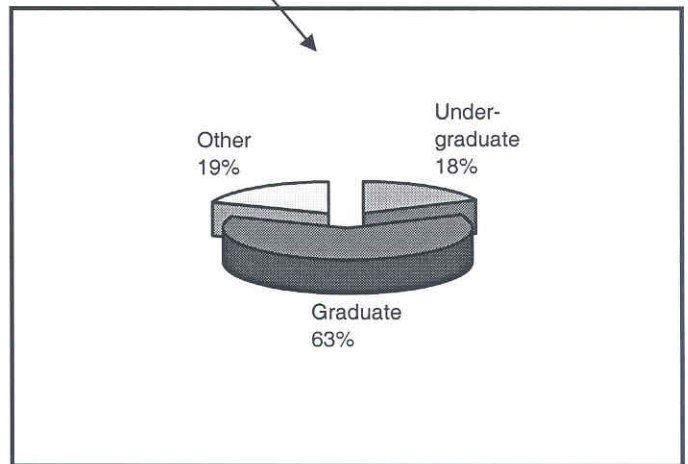
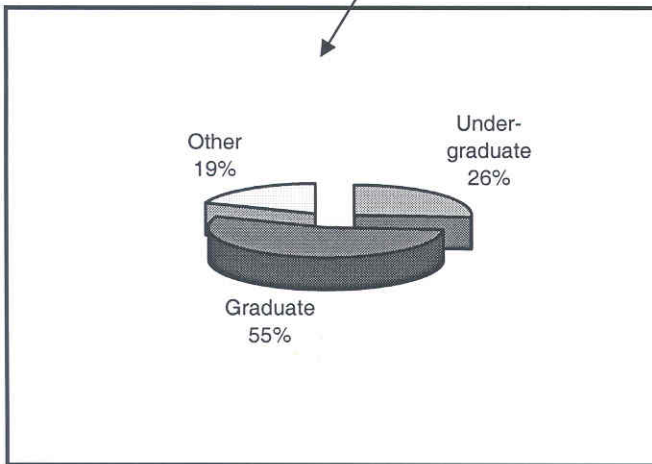
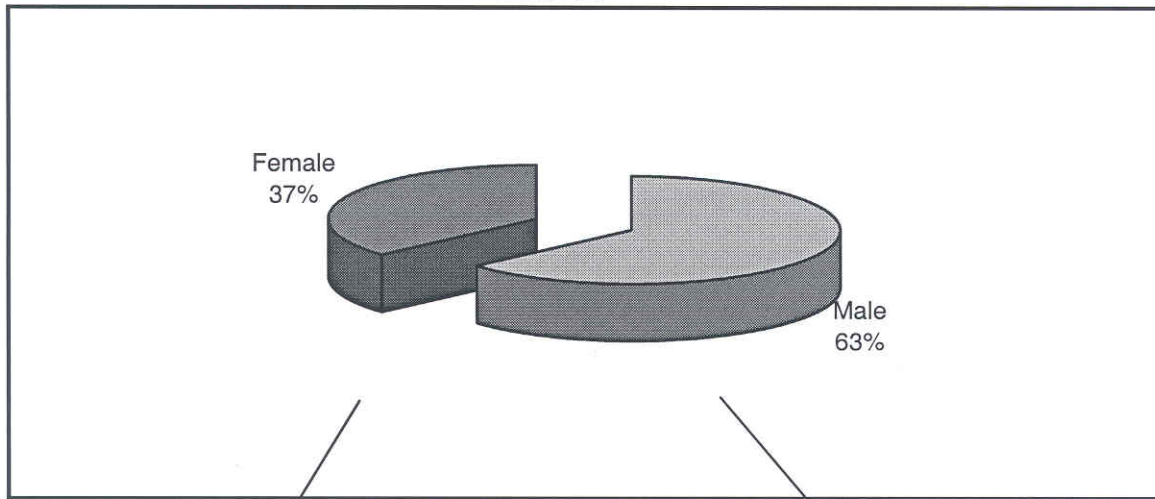

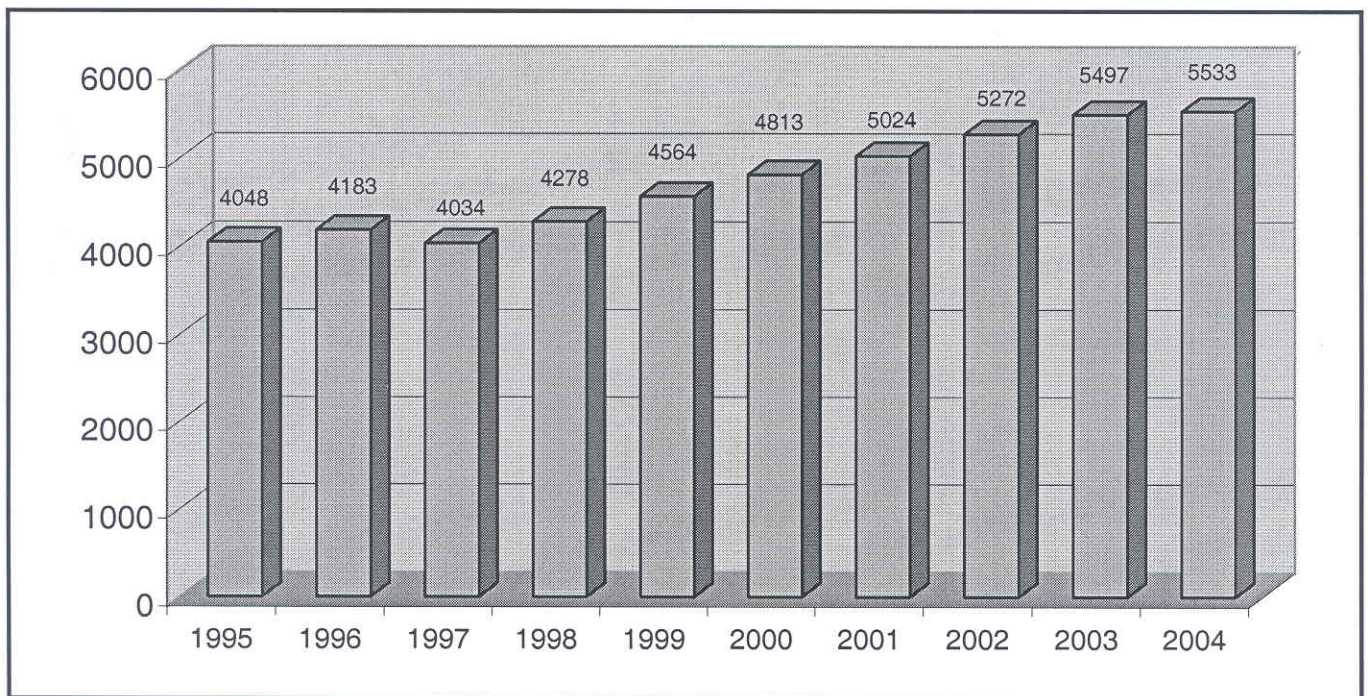

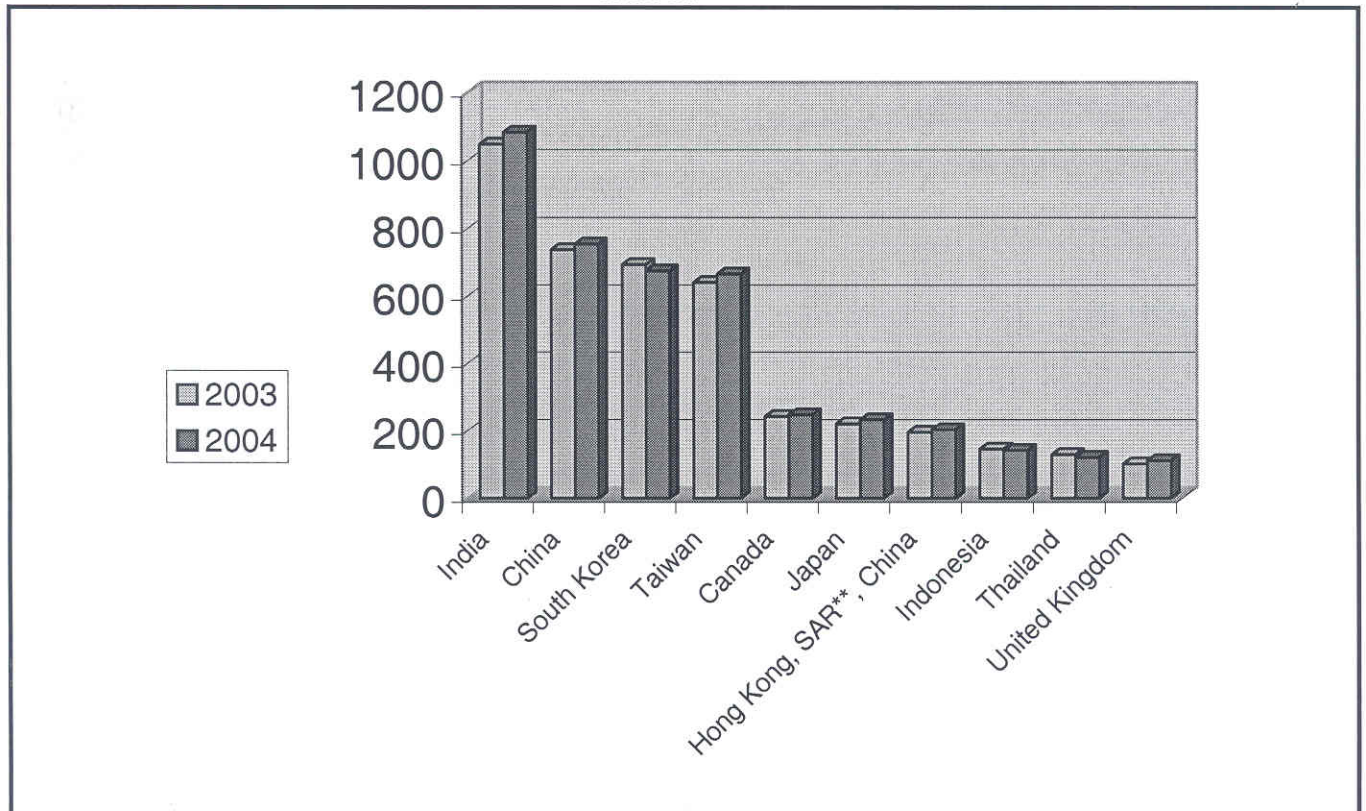

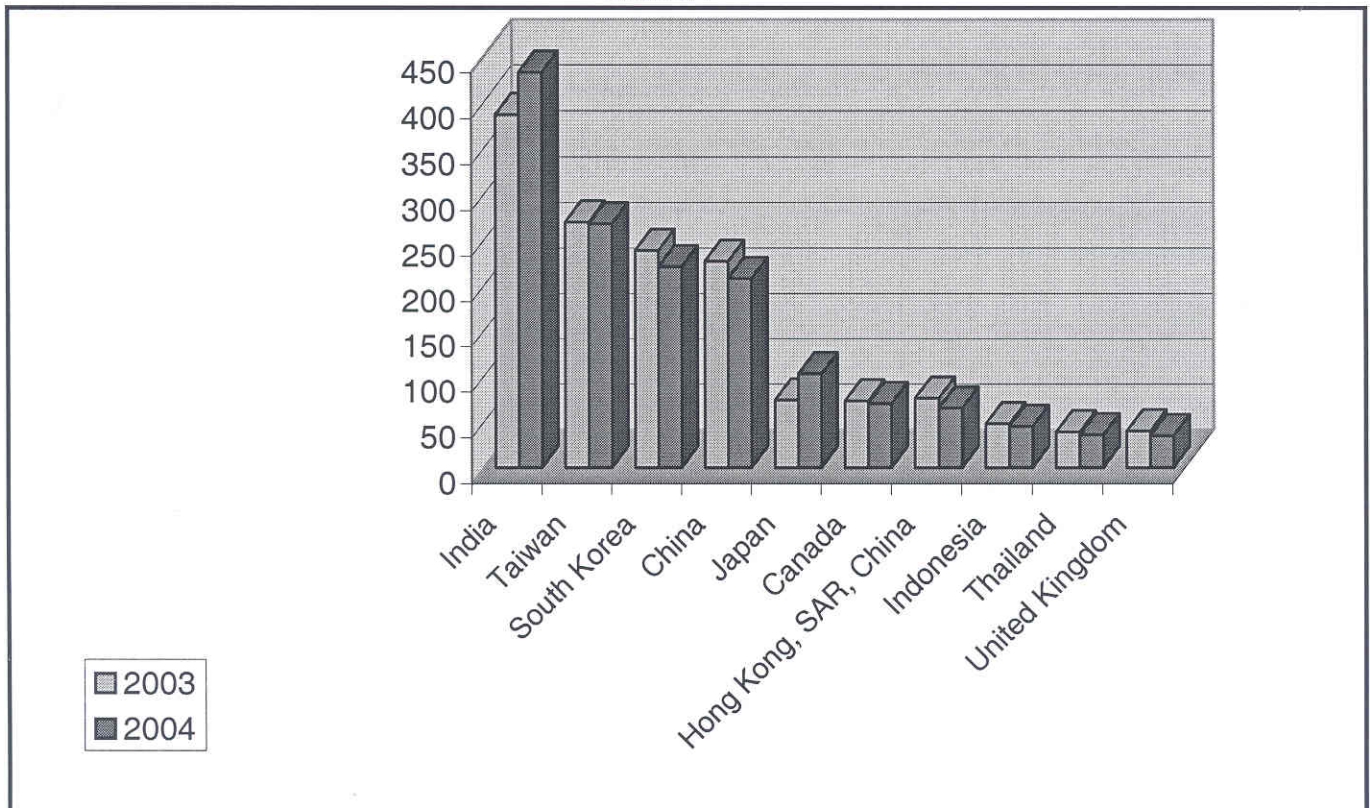

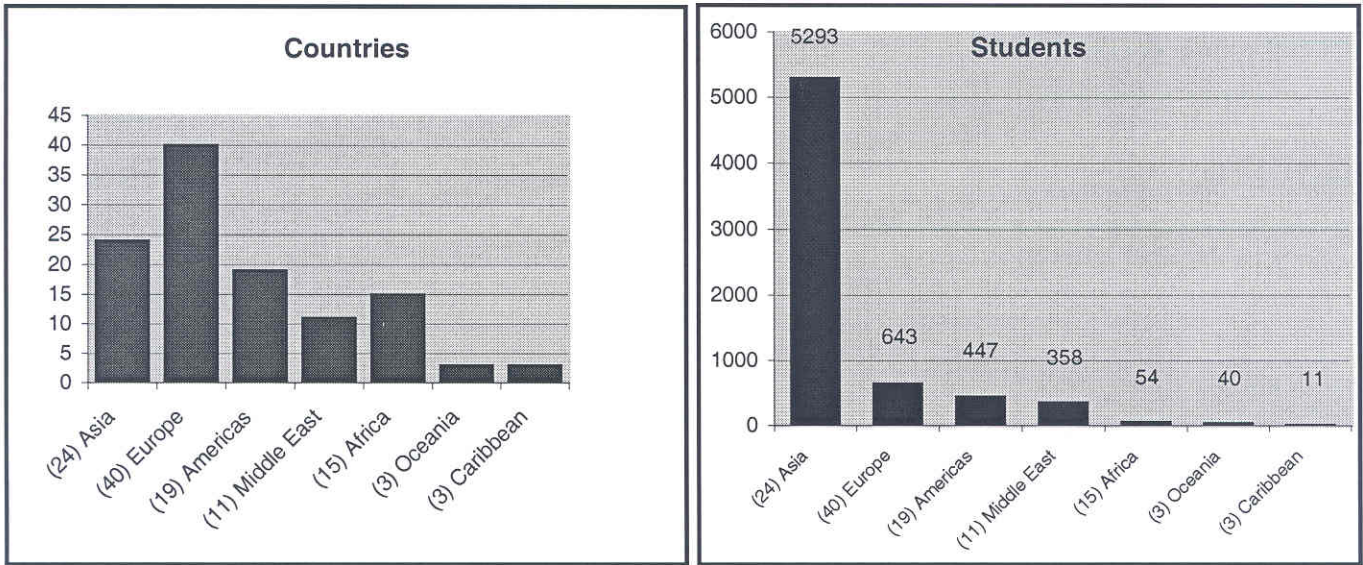

() Represents numbers of countries/economies represented

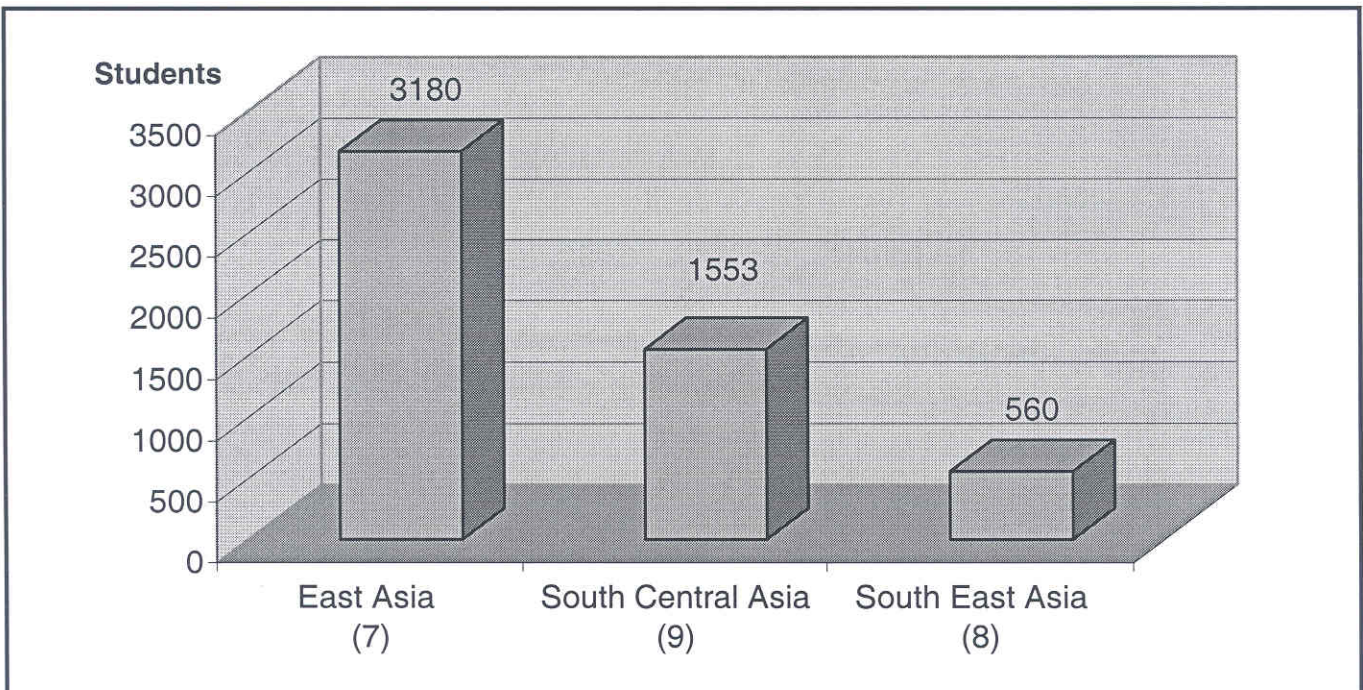
